### Museum Musings - Benny Shoults, Museum and Exhibits Committee Chair

What to look for in our museums and exhibits around town

Hair Studio Window (33 N. Sandusky St, Delaware) – We have maintained a presence in downtown Delaware since 2013 by displaying window vignettes of various historical themes, featuring over 24 exhibits during that time. Recently two informational panels were installed that will remain in the window permanently. The latest display was a Christmas theme featuring a 1950s style train set around a shadow box tree with various antique books, toys and dolls in each box. My reward for this happened on the night I set it up: as I was placing the trains on the track, I looked up and there were about half a dozen children's faces pressed up against the window all cheering, "make it go!". If you haven't seen the display yet, stop by before Feb. 10 when the new theme "Farms and Farm Implements" will be installed. A perfect chance to do so would be on First Friday (Feb. 3) - DCHS will be participating in the Chocolate Walk from the Hair Studio where volunteers dressed in period costumes will be passing out candy.



Nash House (157 E. William St, Delaware) – Maggie Webb, curator, did a wonderful job decorating the Nash House for the annual Christmas Open House, which was attended by around 70 people. If you missed it, you will have another chance at the end of 2017, however you can visit the house any Sunday afternoon (2-5). Next up for the Nash House is renovation of the bathroom to return it to working condition representative of the 1930s-40s era.

**Meeker Homestead Museum** (2690 Stratford Rd) – Installation of the heating and air conditioning unit on the second floor of the Meeker House is about to be completed. This major improvement will allow a much more pleasant visit through the museum and allow the preservation of our collections that are displayed there, the first of which will be a permanent Native American exhibit in the second upstairs bedroom.

### Help the Historian - Share your knowledge and artifacts with the Historical Society



What do you know about a mine on the east side of Delaware?



In early January, the Society received an email (at info@delawareohiohistory.org) from Louis Daehnke, who lived in Delaware when he was a boy. He asked about the undeveloped property, accessible from the end of Frank Street, on the east side of Delaware, which he explored with his friends in the early 1940's. There were mounds of slate, and on the east side of these slate banks there was an entrance to a mine.

We did some research on the property, and determined the names of some of the previous owners including Charles H. and Frances Clark, Leonard and William Denison, John Quinn (b. 1841, d. 11/24/1913) and Israel J. Richardson (d. 5/11/1870). According to Mr. Richardson's obituary, he was "engaged in extensive canal and railroad contracts" including the Erie Canal, but we could find no mention anywhere of a mine. If you know anything about a mine on this property, please share it with us.
